The **Diocesan Youth Council (DYC)** is an advisory body to the Diocesan Office for Youth & Young Adults (OYYA). It is a group of High School teens who represent the parishes and Catholic high schools in the Catholic Diocese of Gary. The members of this body advise the Office in two ways. First, they act as a spokesperson for the needs of youth in their parishes and schools. Second, are an integral part of the planning and implementation of youth activities that encourage and support total youth ministry in the diocese.
